- Follow the School Rules for behaviour..

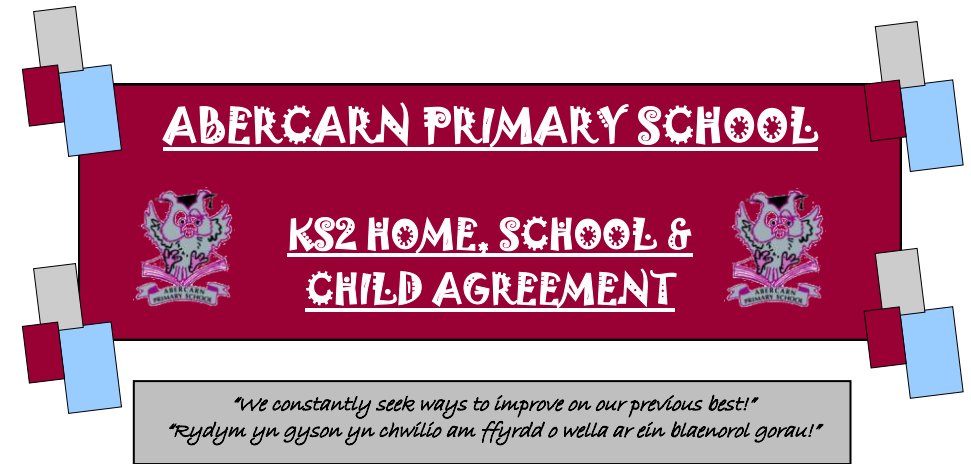
School Rules
